**Why Assigning A Proxy-holder Is Important
 IF YOU ARE NOT ATTENDING**

The proxy form was **NOT** included in the election packet this year. With the new Vote-by-mail procedures approved and in place, your properly completed mailed-in-ballot WILL be counted, whether you assign a proxy-holder or not, and your mailed-in ballot will count as attendance for the quorum purposes, whether or not you are able to attend the Annual Membership Meeting.

If you are **UNABLE** to attend the **Annual Membership Meeting on July 13, 2008**, where new business may come up, it is strongly encouraged that you designate another person (your “proxy-holder”) who would exercise your voting rights on new business that arises at the meeting. Otherwise, if new business is brought up at the meeting you will not have a vote on that new business! **Be sure that who ever you designate as your proxy-hold will be present at the Membership Meeting!**

Since the proxy form was **NOT** included in the voting packet this year, that means that you can either contact the KPOA administration office before the office closes on Friday, July 11th to obtain one or use the proxy form supplied in this month’s *newSkoop* July issue. Actually, a proxy form can be on any kind of piece of paper and does not have to be on any “official” form. But for your convenience we have provided one for you to use as is or as an example where you can create your own. Please note that you need to fill in your unit number. For ease of counting and accuracy, if you own more than one lot, you may want to fill out one form for each lot. Your lot number is your “unit number” not your address!.

With regards to voting for the board candidates, while you may vote for up to three candidates it is strongly urged that you vote for **ONLY** the candidate(s) that you feel is qualified and supports your viewpoints.

ONLY the candidate(s) that you feel is qualified and supports your viewpoints.

For example, if you only see one candidate that you feel is qualified, YOU DO NOT HAVE TO VOTE FOR THREE! You can simply vote for one (or two) candidates. One thing you can't do is vote for the same person three times on the same ballot. If you have any questions or confusion about the ballot and proxy system please email us before sending in your materials to KPOA to contact@ttpnewsletter.com.

The person you assign your proxy-holder must vote in accordance with your wishes as expressed on the ballot unless you leave the ballot blank, in which case the proxy-holder will vote according to his/her discretion. Be sure the

person you designate as your proxy-holder is aware of that fact. You may use the form to assign someone to vote your written ballot (the board candidates), if desired.

If you are UNABLE to attend the Annual Membership Meeting on July 13, 2008, where new business may come up, it is strongly encouraged that you designate another person (your "proxy-holder") who would exercise your voting rights on new business that arises at the meeting.

from the jefferson county administrator's desk:

Hello to my fellow Kala Point neighbors! Last month we gave you some information from Public Works about the Transportation Improvement Plan and the Shoreline Master Program (SMP) Update. This month I'd like to give you a few tips from our County Public Health department, along with an update on SMP public outreach in July.

Proper Disposal of Prescription Drugs

The County's Public Health department issues public information bulletins on a regular basis regarding topics that pertain to our citizens. This particular post is from Federal Guidelines.

- Take unused, unneeded, or expired prescription drugs out of their original containers and throw them in the trash.
- Mixing prescription drugs with an undesirable substance, such as used coffee grounds or kitty litter, and putting them in impermeable, non-descript containers, such as empty cans or sealable bags will further ensure the drugs are not diverted.
- Flush prescription drugs down the toilet only if the label or accompanying patient information specifically instructs doing so. The FDA advises that the following drugs be flushed instead of thrown in the trash: Actiq, Daytrana Transdermal Patch, Duragesic Transdermal System, OxyContin Tablets, Avinza Capsules, Baraclude Tablets, Reyataz Capsules, Tequin Tablets, Zerit for Oral Solution, Meperidine HCl Tablets, Percocet, Xyrem and Fentora. (Not being a medical professional, they sound like a foreign language—check your prescriptions!) Note: Patients should always refer to printed material accompanying their medication for specific instructions.
- Take advantage of community pharmaceutical take-back programs that allow the public to bring

unused drugs to a central location for proper disposal. Some communities have these programs that allow the public to bring unused drugs to a central location for proper disposal. Where these exist, they are a good way to dispose of unused pharmaceuticals.

Jefferson County Public Health recommends that no medications be flushed down the toilet if you have an onsite sewage system. Instead, dispose of them in the trash as instructed above, or return them to the pharmacy.

Shoreline Master Program (SMP) Update

A revised *Committee Working Draft Shoreline Master Program* was released to the public in May. Supplemental technical documents including the *Final Shoreline Inventory & Characterization Report* and the *Shoreline Restoration Plan* were released in mid-June. Informal public comment will be accepted until July 11, 2008, on these three documents.

casual Q&A, along with daytime focus group meetings on key issues and culminating in an evening public meeting to showcase the draft proposal before its deadline for informal public comment the next day, on July 11th.

Conductor Karl Bach begins his 8th season with the Summer Band this year. He welcomes all band musicians who can play high school-level music.

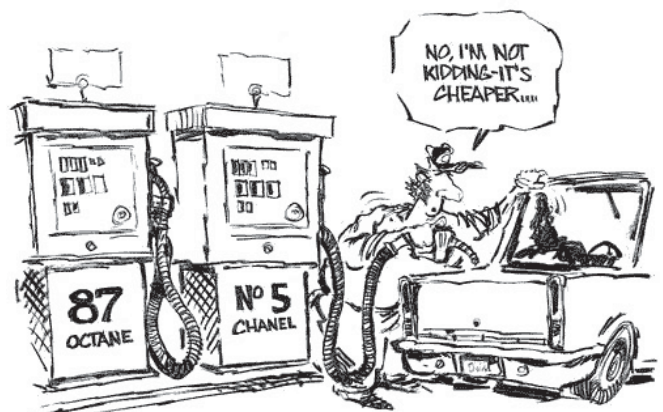

school bond election update

As most of you know, the results of the May 20th vote on the school bond issue showed that it lost by the narrow margin of 59.06% for and 49.94% against. It needed 127 more yes votes to pass. **Five precincts voted against the issue:** Gardiner III (4 yes, 11 no), North Jacob (70 yes, 84 no), Port Discovery (30 yes, 59 no), Crocker Lake (5 yes, 15 no) and Kala Point (289 yes, 343 no). Of a total of 13 precincts, Kala Point had the highest voter turnout of 61.52%.

The Port Townsend School Board has announced that it will place another bond issue on the Nov. 4th ballot, which will also be the election for federal, state and local offices. The dollar amount of the bond issue has not yet been decided.

Follow-up:

Understanding and Selling Call Options:

I've received several comments and questions about my last finance article on writing covered calls.

In answering one question, it is not necessary to buy the stock and simultaneously sell the call. The stock can be purchased and the call sold at a later date. In doing that, the investor assumes more risk but also may make a greater profit. If the call option is not sold when the stock is purchased and the stock then declines, the option seller will receive a smaller premium for the option contract when he sells it. Conversely, if the stock goes up, the option seller will receive a greater premium when he sells the option. To remove the speculative aspects of the strategy, it's advisable to buy the stock and simultaneously sell the option.
